


Problem with Java SDK (Development Kit) when installing SAP on Windows XP Professional 44 bit








Below is the setting for the JAVA\_HOME environment variables



Step 2: Install Oracle (3 CDs): result is OK, no problem

Step 3: Install SAP and receive the error at the very first stage:



I try to uninstall Java and reinstall it. I don't understand what type of Java or what particular Java file that SAP needs to initial the setup process. I type "javac.exe" and "java\*.\*" in search bar and locate every folder in the computer where java files locate and change the path in the Windows environment variables but no to avail.
